

## Rodenticide and Bait Stations

Bait stations are available by request via email. The first two are free while supplies last, but additional bait stations can be ordered for a fee. Scan the QR Code to order via email.

CDFA rodenticide bait is available for purchase from the following County Agricultural Commissioner's offices: Alameda, Fresno, Kings, Los Angeles, Merced, Monterey, San Benito, San Joaquin, and Tulare.

**IMPORTANT** - For rats in orchards and vineyards, bait stations cannot be placed on the ground, they must be elevated at least three feet on tree branches.

## Recent CDFA Label Amendments

- **Zinc Phosphide Treated Grain (2%)** now includes hand baiting and ground broadcast for Norway and roof rats within dormant orchards. Zinc Phosphide (2%) is not for use in bait stations.
- **Diphacinone Treated Grain (0.005%)** the minimum bait station placement height for rats in orchards and vineyards was reduced from five feet to three feet. Bait stations must be securely attached to lateral tree branches. For rat control in orchards and vineyards, bait stations cannot be placed on the ground.
